Many national Constitutions and laws recognize and protect different elements of sexual rights, but rarely all. The UN Human Rights Council can play a significant role in promoting and protecting human rights by developing standards for the respect, protection and fulfillment of sexual rights, and providing guidance to UN Member States on how to implement such standards.

One of the ways in which the Council can advance sexual rights is to recognize the intersections with its regular items of work. The panel will address some issues under discussion at the 28th session, including disability, racial discrimination, and the rights of the child, and how they relate to sexual rights.
